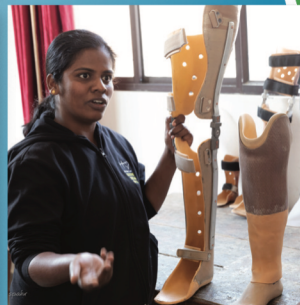

The Higgins Brothers Surgicenter for Hope (HBSH) was dedicated on 12/10/2016 in Fonds Parisien Haiti. The fully staffed facility, open 24/7, is the only surgical facility running continuously in this entire region of Haiti. Annually, 700 operative procedures are done as well as over 400 babies delivered.

In January 2020, the HBSH assumed management of the Christ for All Hospital that includes hospital care for medical and pediatric patients as well as medical, pediatric, HIV, and dental clinics. The new Shawn Warren Crowley Medical Building opened in 2021 providing space for these clinics that have over 20,000 patient visits per year. Also as part of its mission, the HBSH provides training for Haitian surgical residents. The medical campus is continuing to expand. Over the next 2 years the ER & OR areas will be enlarged; a laboratory, patient care ward, and a hemodialysis unit will be added; and the maternity center will be replaced.

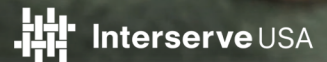

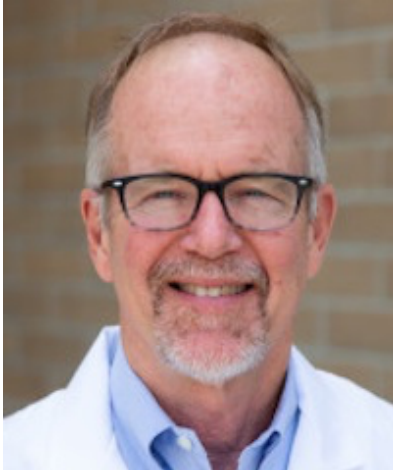

Professionals who serve forgotten people inspire their colleagues toward similar service. INMED is pleased to celebrate this tradition by announcing the recipients of the 2022 INMED Awards.

INMED Comninellis Award for Compassionate Service to Humanity



Tom Kettler, MD

This award was established by the INMED Board of Directors to recognize people who demonstrate care and concern for those in need, who give selflessly of their time and resources, and who inspire others to take similar action.

The 2022 Comninellis Award for Compassionate Service to Humanity recipient is Tom Kettler. Dr. Kettler has been a career family physician with College Park Family Care Center in Stanley, Kansas. Deeply concerned about health care in Kansas City's urban core, Dr. Kettler led a coalition of community leaders to establish the Hope Family Care Center at 31st St. and Prospect Avenue. This

faith-based family medical practice provides quality primary healthcare in Kansas City, Missouri's east side. All patients are welcome including both insured and uninsured. Dr. Kettler attributes his tenacity in establishing and leading Hope Family Care Center to his faith in Christ and commitment to a lifelong journey of learning and service to others.

INMED International Medicine Award



Sam Fabiano, MD

This award recognizes those who have made a significant contribution to health in developing nations. Award recipients have demonstrated uncommon dedication and endurance in pursuit of this cause.

The 2022 INMED International Medicine Award recipient is Sam Fabiano. A native of Angola, Africa, Dr. Fabiano displayed an early interest in healthcare. He studied medicine in St. Petersburg, Russia and then completed a five-year surgery residency with the Pan African Academy of Christian Surgeons at Bongolo Hospital, Gabon. Dr. Fabiano recently returned to Angola with his wife

Amanda, and daughter, Bella, where they serve today at CEML Hospital. A general surgeon in the fullest sense, Dr. Fabiano also provides GYN, orthopedic, and even neurosurgical care in a nation where such skills are rare. In Dr. Fabiano's vision also includes CEML hospital training future surgeons to continue serving the nation of Angola.

Awards

INMED National Healthcare Service Award



Barry Bacon, MD

Many health care professionals within their own nations are sacrificing personal comfort to care for their neglected neighbors. The award recipients are role models in providing health care for their own people.

The 2022 INMED National Healthcare Service Award recipient is Barry Bacon. After completing medical school and family medicine training, Dr. Bacon worked at a mission hospital in Malawi, southern Africa, and was medical director for 16 remote site clinics for 3 years. Upon returning to the US, he practiced and taught full-spectrum family medicine in rural northeast Washington. Dr. Bacon has

continued to stay connected to global health, particularly through teaching physicians in Rwanda, Ethiopia, Kenya, and Malawi. His work also includes creating a peace initiative between two warring tribes in northern Kenya and working with the lost boys of South Sudan to create a medical school to transform health outcomes in that region of the world. In the United States, he especially loves working on health disparities in his local community in Washington state, especially on behalf of those afflicted by addiction, mental health, poverty, and homelessness. Most remarkable of these initiatives is Dr. Bacon's work to establish Hope Street Project to alleviate homelessness in Colville, WA, and creating a business to employ homeless men to take uninhabited buildings and create beautiful living spaces.

INMED Cross-Cultural Healthcare Service Award



Allison Judkins, MD

This award recognizes one who demonstrates care and concern for culturally diverse communities and who gives selflessly of time and resources for their benefit.

The 2022 INMED Cross-Cultural Healthcare Service Award recipient is Allie Judkins. Dr. Judkins serves as Associate Director for Global Health Research in the Division of Neonatology at the University of Utah. There, she mentors health care professionals in health quality improvement projects overseas. Dr. Judkins works as content expert for neonatal resuscitation for the Global Section of the American Academy of Pediatrics and advises training and implementation teams on several continents. She also works at the Center for Medical Innovation at the University of Utah: This organization works to take ideas from "Bench to Bedside" through its maternal-child health promotion programs in India, Nepal, and Kenya. Dr. Judkins continues to be instrumental in overcoming challenges in such low-income countries that result in improving access and quality of life and health. Throughout her career in global health Dr. Judkins continues to engage in the frontline of global medicine in India and Nepal, directing multiple maternal neonatal programs in collaboration with the government.

Awards

Mark Muilenberg

This award recognizes individuals who have made an important impact in the training of the next generation of international healthcare volunteers. Through their instruction and their role modeling, award recipients express the value of everyone.

The 2022 International Healthcare Preceptor Award recipient is Mark Muilenberg. An ultrasound technologist originally from the Iowa City area, Mark Muilenberg's career is largely focused on equipping healthcare professionals with critical ultrasound skills essential for underserved communities. Such teaching has brought him to Africa and Asia, and several times to teach at INMED. Realizing the limits of infrastructure in low resource communities, he is currently very involved in the product development of a wireless, battery-powered, cell-phone-sized, high-resolution ultrasound scanner. When he's not abroad teaching ultrasound, Mark Muilenberg shares his skill at a crisis pregnancy center in Naples, Florida.

INMED Humanitarian Crisis Response Award



Ted Higgins, MD

This award recognizes individuals and organizations who provide exemplary disaster response services for highly vulnerable communities. In doing so, they accentuate the value of life and provide an exemplary model for us all.

The 2022 International Healthcare Preceptor Award recipient is Ted Higgins. As a resident physician, Dr. Higgins served a three-month surgical elective at Hospital Albert Schweitzer in Haiti where he was mentored by Dr. William Larimer Mellon. The experience proved pivotal for this young physician. A general and vascular surgeon in Kansas City, in 1995 Dr. Higgins began providing surgical care on trips to Haiti and Dominican Republic. Burdened over the need for consistent surgical care in these nations, Dr. Higgins founded the Higgins Brothers Surgicenter for Hope, a health center located in Fonds-Parisien, Haiti. The role of the surgery center is both patient care and training patient surgeons. Thus, under Dr. Higgins leadership, the Surgicenter was well positioned on the front lines providing care during Haiti's Hurricane Matthew in 2016 and Hurricane Laura in 2020.

Allison Judkins, MD

Dr. Judkins serves as Associate Director for Global Health Research in the Division of Neonatology at the University of Utah, mentoring students, residents and other allied health care professionals in various quality improvement projects overseas. She also works closely with Dr. Bernhard Fassel through the CMI, operates global programs in India, Nepal and Kenya with the goal to improve access and quality of health services sustainably and improve population health through innovation and research projects primarily focusing on maternal-child health. As site leader in India, Dr. Judkins has been the primary US contact in the design of work and research processes which allows us to overcome challenges in low income countries, and improve access and quality of care for women and children in rural Gujarat.

Throughout her global work, innovation and improvement of systems has been a major priority. She has presented at both regional and national conferences regarding this important work.



Barry Bacon, MD

After completing medical school and family medicine training, Dr. Bacon worked at a mission hospital in Blantyre, Malawi, and was medical director for 16 remote site clinics for 3 years from 1987-1990. Upon returning to the US, he practiced and taught full-spectrum family medicine in rural northeast Washington. Dr. Bacon has looked for ways to stay connected to global health and has realized by teaching physicians in Rwanda, Ethiopia, Kenya, Malawi, and elsewhere that one of the most significant contributions we can give to the world is medical education.



Calvin Wilson, MD

Dr. Wilson has been involved in the development of family medicine and education in a variety of settings for over 30 years, and in international community and medical development projects for over 22 years. Although currently retired, he continues as a clinical professor of family medicine at the University of Colorado Anschutz School of Medicine. He serves as an associate medical director of the Center for Personalized Education for Physicians of Colorado. Dr. Wilson was the founding director of the Center for Global Health of the University of Colorado Anschutz Health Sciences Center, which is dedicated to promoting and coordinating a variety of global health-related activities. He most recently worked

in Rwanda as the director of a partnership between the University of Colorado and the National University of Rwanda to develop their newly reopened residency programs and develop a new family and community medicine residency. In the past, he developed a primary healthcare continuing education program for the physicians, nurses, midwives, health workers and laboratory technicians of the public sector of Jordan, as well as consulting with the Jordan Medical Council in the development of their national CME initiative. He also initiated the training of the first primary health care trainers in post-war Iraq and Ecuador. He has been a past President of the Advisory Board of the Center for International Health Initiatives of the American Academy of Family Physicians, and has received a number of awards for his global health activities.

Dana Hawkinson, MD

After completing an Infectious Disease fellowship at the University of Kansas Medical Center in 2010, Dr. Hawkinson became faculty at the University of Kansas Medical Center. In addition to his general infectious disease duties, either on the inpatient consult service or the outpatient clinics, he is the medical director for the Infection Control and Prevention (IPAC) program. David Culpepper, MD, FACP

Dr. Culpepper is an internist at HopeHealth in Florence, South Carolina, where he also serves as Associate Faculty for the University of South Carolina School of Medicine. Dr. Culpepper is certified in echocardiography and internal medicine and has provided volunteer medical services to marginalized people in Brazil, Peru, Bolivia, Romania, and Kenya.



Debra Conley, PA-C

After a 20 year career as a special educator, Debra decided to fulfill a long-time dream of practicing medicine by becoming a Physician Assistant. She attended Duke University's PA program and graduated in 2006. She spent the next 8 years practicing pediatrics in rural North Carolina before moving to Milwaukee and has practiced family medicine for the past several years. She has a deep desire to serve the "underserved", and has been able to do so through volunteer medical missions to Kenya and as a volunteer provider at a local free clinic.



Glen Talboy, MD

Glenn Talboy is the Chairman of Surgery at the University of Missouri - Kansas City and the Program Director for the general surgery residency program. He has been involved in international surgical missions for over a decade and lead author on two surgical wound care chapters entitled "Essentials of Surgery."

Ted Higgins, MD

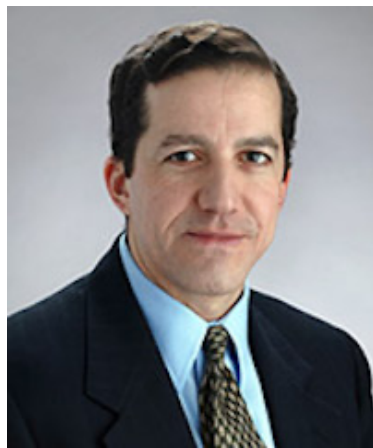

Sean Mark, MD

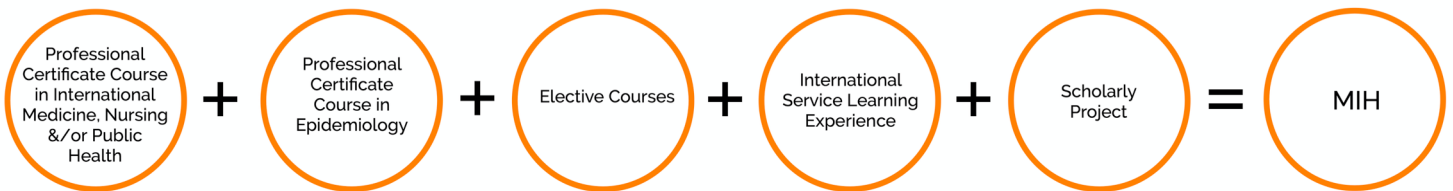

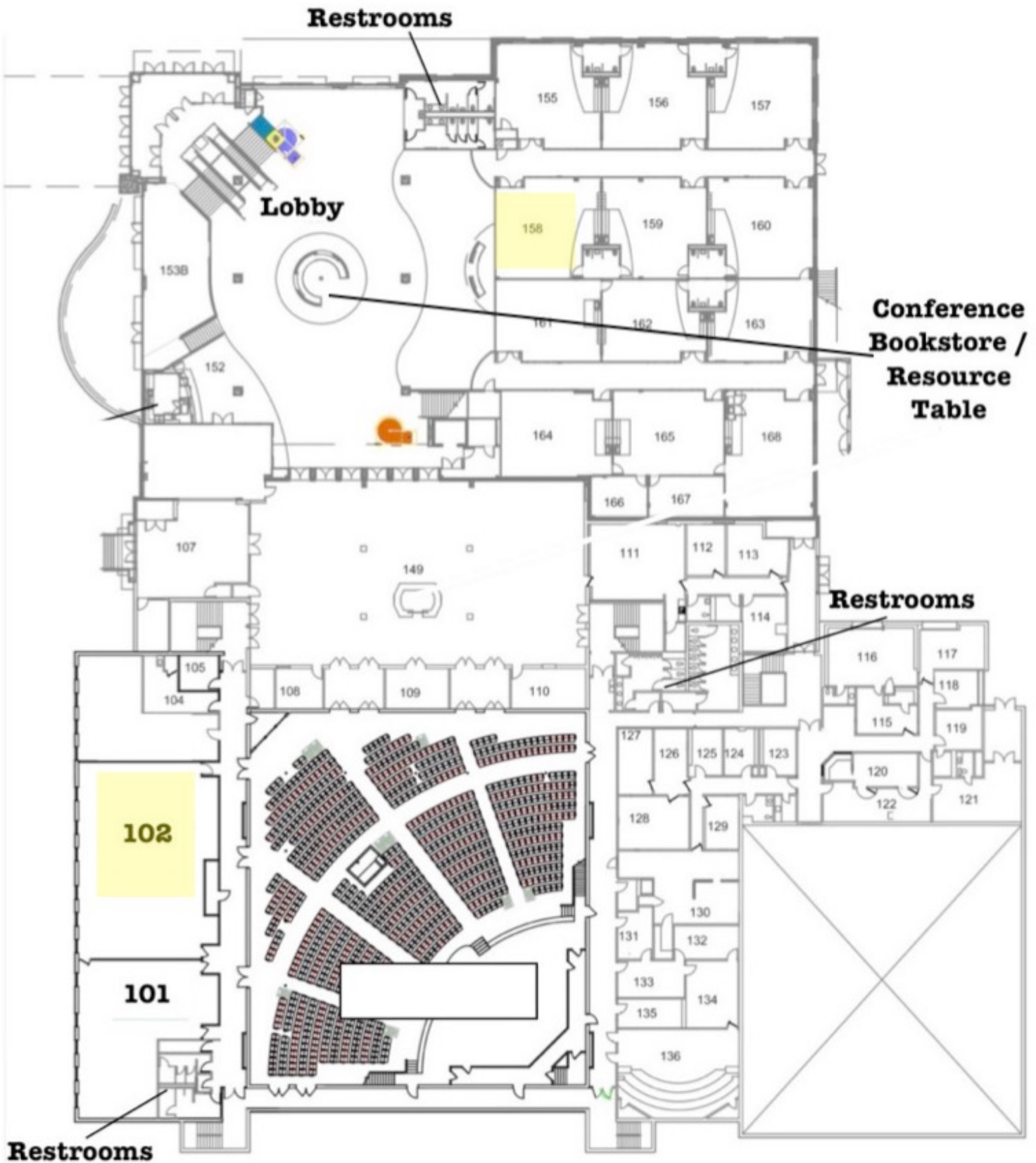

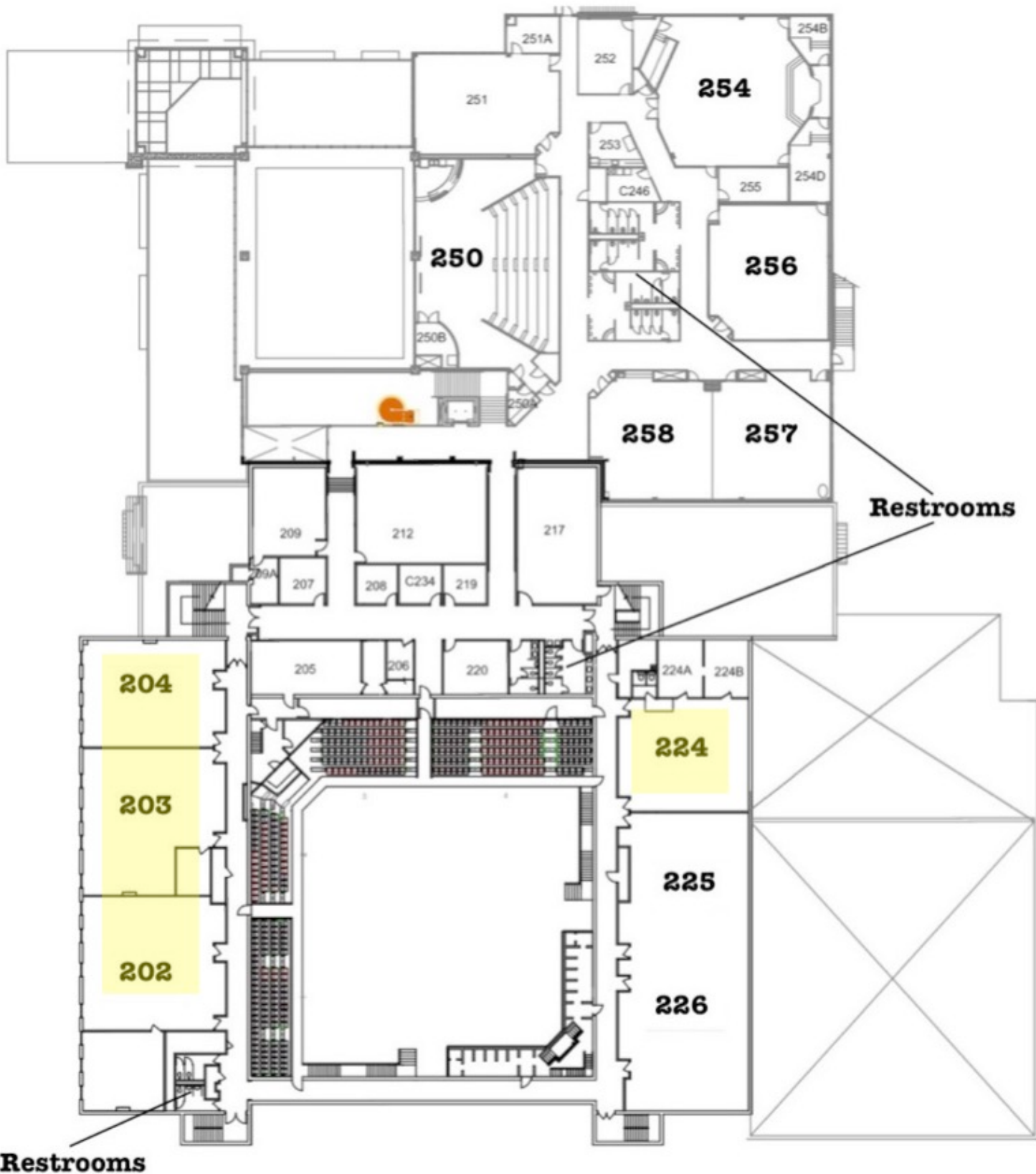
