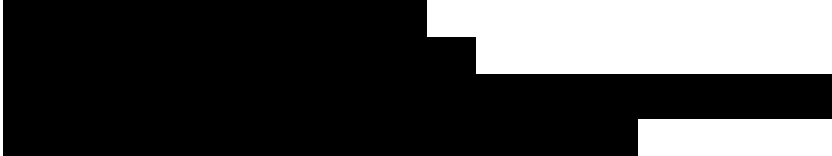

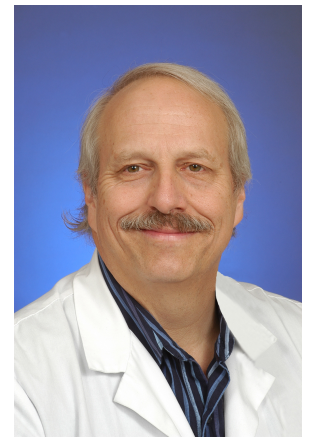



II. **SERVICE ACTIVITIES:**

1. **Clinical Service (Patient Care)**

a. **Clinical Productivity**

- I have performed 3-6 weeks of inpatient academic service per year, and 3 clinic sessions per week of outpatient primary care, one session of which I supervise care provided by Family Medicine residents. I have also led the establishment of the "Bulldoc" teaching clinic, conducted with first and second year medical students, in which I provide direct clinical services and recruit other physicians, nurses and students who also do so, on a rota basis. My clinical productivity is calculated based on inpatient and outpatient relative value units, which arise from direct provision of outpatient services by me, and those provided while I am supervising residents. I have consistently exceeded my wRVU target goals every year of the last 5.
- I have continued to build and expand my outpatient ambulatory practice. I have established care with more than 750 Bhutanese Nepali-speaking patients. I provide care to them directly, and do so without need for an interpreter as I am fluent in their language. Arising from this, I have collaborated with a community-based non-profit organization to create the **Center for Immigrant and Refugee Research and Clinical Evaluation**, via funding from the Patient Centered Outcomes Research Institute (see Section IV, Research)
- This year, I moved half my clinical practice to Vibrant Health, including about half of my panel of Bhutanese Nepali-speaking patients**

b. **Quality of Care:**

- Because > 90% of my patient population is non-literate in any language (most of them are Bhutanese or other refugees), I have requested and obtained assessments of my clinical work from patients from Bhutanese, Burmese and Latino backgrounds (uploaded to Sharepoint). These referees or their family members have received services from me directly. They have also participated with me in community-based participatory research to build a research agenda to improve clinical care for limited English populations. Patient letters therefore also provide the wider perspectives of patients from each group.

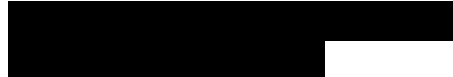
