Prolonged second stage of labor



Maternal exhaustion



Indications to avoid pushing



Efficient contractions (3+/10 min, lasting at least 40 sec)



Gestational age at least 34 weeks



Estimated fetal weight ≥2500 g, but <4000 g


First stage of labor or Prolonged second stage, but does not meet criteria








Do not perform routine episiotomy!

BP

Only pull during contractions



Deliver head

Remove cup



Support birth Prepare for shoulder dystocia

Abandon vacuum if:

The cup slips off 3 times

No descent after 3 pulls

No delivery after 30 minutes

Evidence of scalp trauma

Seek advanced care

Assess for injury and complications

Monitor closely



Continue care
